Good afternoon parents, carers and students,

Australians schools under the Australian Student Wellbeing Framework are learning communities that promote student wellbeing, safety and positive relationships so that students can reach their full potential. As taken from the framework, "Students who feel connected, safe and secure are more likely to be active participants in their learning and to achieve better physical, emotional, social and educational outcomes." Thank you for staying connected with your child's classroom teacher and supporting the growth of your child. I am appreciative of your positive feedback regarding our partnership in continuing to create an inclusive and connected school culture.

With the Wellbeing Framework, in mind, I ask for your support both in and around our school community. Smokers can you please adhere to the signs about smoking. In NSW, we are required to be 4 metres from any entry point to a government site. On the spot fines can be issued for these offences. It is important that our students and the community are not walking through smoke as they enter the school gates. It is also important that we model respectful language. Students are reporting the offensive language they are hearing just outside the gates.

Thank you for working together as a community for the best interests of our children.

School gates will be locked at 9am. The main gate will still be accessible for community. Thank you for your understanding, as we continue to adapt according to all of our student's needs.

Every student at East Hills Public School is known, valued and cared for. Thank you for taking the time to discuss your child's learning, individual needs and goals with classroom teachers. The meetings you continue to have, are pivotal in the learning journey and our partnership with you in supporting each and every student. You would have also received the yearly information booklet, which is a great reference for stage expectations, upcoming themes, excursions and stage appropriate events and learning. I encourage you to connect with your child's learning via the Seesaw App. This application provides every parent the opportunity to be insiders in their child's learning. The SLSO's role is to support student's needs as addressed in individualised education plans. SLSO's are not able to comment on student academic growth or behaviour. 
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
